CRIMINAL JUSTICE SYSTEM NEWS – OCTOBER 2007

Adult Incarceration

Bookings increased slightly from September's 10,987 to October's 11,279. The **Average Daily Population increased** from 9,723 to 9,739; this is the largest population since November 2005. The **pretrial population slightly decreased** in October (6,575) compared to September (6,586). The **sentenced and agency hold populations slightly increased:** sentenced from 2,747 to 2,761 and agency holds from 337 to 358. **Overall ALOS increased** from 25.8 days to 26.8 days. **The ALOS for sentenced also increased:** sentenced from 25.4 to 28.6 days, while **the ALOS for agency holds decreased** from 64.5 to 60.8 days. **Pretrial ALOS decreased** from 8.4 days to 7.5 days.

Superior Court Filings & Case Processing

Criminal filings increased from September (3,382) to October (3,676). **Terminations increased** significantly from 2,897 to 3,390. The resulting clearance rate was 92.2%. **The active pending case inventory increased,** as it has every month since January, from 11,663 in September to 11,916 (most ever). **Filings into RCC increased** in October (2,259) compared to September (2,092), while **filings into EDC also increased** from 1,045 in September to 1,189 in October. **The number of trials increased** from 77 in September to 88 in October. **The trial rate stayed almost the same,** increasing from 2.3% to 2.4%.

Justice Court Filings

Forcible detainer filings increased from September (7,182) to October (7,303). Overall, October total filings were 37,252 compared to September's 35,060.


Adult Probation

Pretrial general and intensive supervision increased from September to October: general from 773 to 868 (highest since September 2006 – 885); intensive from 1,164 to 1,308 (highest ever). Electronic monitoring increased from 220 to 249. **Levels of standard probation supervision increased** from 29,960 to 30,889, while **levels of intensive probation supervision also decreased** from 1,133 in September to 1,081 in October.





Average Daily Jail Population by Type





Overall Average Length of Stay in Jail




Average Length of Stay in Jail for Agency Holds





Average Length of Stay in Jail Pretrial vs Sentenced Population




Average Length of Stay in Jail for Pretrial Inmates

- Overall Pretrial ALS




Sheriff's Office Transports for Inmate Court Appearances






Direct Filing began in May 2002



Direct Complaints into Superior Court




Grand Jury Indictments





Superior Court Trials Completed




Active Pending Criminal Case Inventory




Justice Court Filings October 2007



Pretrial Supervision Defendant Monitoring Unit




Pretrial Supervision Defendants on Electronic Monitoring




Disposition of Cases Terminated


Average monthly dispositions by quarter



Status of Cases After 180 Days




Adult Probation Standard Supervision Population




Adult Probation Intensive Supervision Population




Juvenile Detention Average Daily Population



Juvenile Detention Average Length of Stay




Juvenile Electronic Monitoring
