Situation Summary:

Two lightning caused fires, Humboldt and Bronco, were ignited in the evening of June 21 as a storm passed from the south, through the Phoenix Metro area, toward the northeast. Due to the ruggedness of the area, immediate fire suppression was not possible by members of the local volunteer, Rural Metro and other fire departments. The two separate fires grew into intensity in the Camp Creek and Tonto Hills areas and merged into one named the Cave Creek Complex fire at about 2000 June 22nd.

Evacuations were ordered by for 250 homes in the Camp Creek area in the afternoon of June 22nd and Tonto Hills residents were placed on standby for possible evacuation. Evacuation of the Tonto Hills residents was upgraded to mandatory at about 2000 hours.

Three hundred fire fighters and 200 MCSO deputies and posse members were activated. Red Cross, Humane Society and the MCART team was activated to respond to

human and animal needs. Humane Society contact number is 602-997-7586 ext. 2084
A Type 1 Incident Management Team has taken over the incident at 2100, 22 June 2005.

During the evening of 22 June, another lightning caused fire occurred at Gladden, 7 miles west of Aguila. Forty five to fifty individuals are being evacuated to the Aguila Fire Station. State Land officials will be touring the area this morning. Aguila Fire Department, MCSO and Red Cross are responding. Fire is named the Jane fire. NFI available at this time.

Maricopa County EOC is monitoring the incident, the Department of Emergency Management has a liaison on scene that is coordinating resource needs with the Forest Service Incident Management Team.
