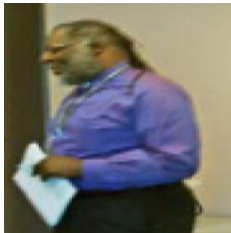

Council members meet on the first Wednesday of every month.

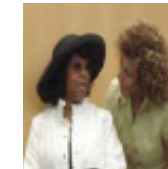
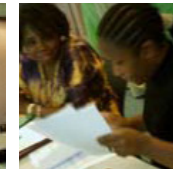
