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### ICJIS Mission Statement

*(Excerpted from the ICJIS Strategic Business Plan)*

The Mission of the Integrated Criminal Justice Information System is to enhance public safety, improve service to the community, and promote quality justice and law enforcement decision making by sharing information that is timely, secure, reliable and comprehensive.

### ICJIS Project Phases

**Phase I** - implement an integration server, identify and implement shared business process improvements, research and implement an 'accused in process' index, implement a secured network backbone and interface to Department of Public Safety.


**Phase II** - extend integration to local, State and Federal justice systems/agencies, continue improvements in County capabilities regarding management information systems and electronic document retrieval.

**Phase III** - provide access services to the public, improve the capabilities regarding integration of electronic documents.

### ICJIS Accomplishments-2001

- ★ Integration of County Systems – acquired and installed software to receive, translate and send data
- ★ Common Case Number Analysis – devised project plan to implement the common number across the system
- ★ Shared Business Processes – analyzed key processes and data exchanges needed
- ★ Security Requirements – analyzed security and installation of network equipment
- ★ Convergent Architectural Direction – completed and accepted plan for agency technology direction



That the Integration Engine, operated by ICJIS, currently connects 9 different applications among our justice and law enforcement agencies? What are they? Sheriff's Office Jail Management (JMS), County Attorney Information System (CAIS), Clerk of the Court Docket Management and Minute Entry Systems (MEEDS), Public Defender Case Management, Juvenile Case Management (JOLTS), Adult Probation Case Management (APETS), Superior Court Case Management (ACS) and the IA Court application.

Since inception and testing in May 2001, the Integration Engine has completed **1,043,014** data exchanges to share data among systems noted above!
