The agenda item proposes revisions to the Maricopa County Environmental Health Code (MCEHC) and associated fees for the following:

Case #/Title: ES-2013-006/Confectionary Food Establishment

Overview: The proposed revision to the MCEHC Chapter VIII creates a new permit (and applicable plan review and permit fees) to allow citizens of Maricopa County to prepare not potentially hazardous bakery and confectionary items for direct consumer sales and for wholesaling to other MCESD permitted food service establishments. The permit definition establishes these food items as an approved food source for sale by other MCESD permitted food establishments.

The Confectionary Food Establishment plan review fee would be \$307.50, which is half the plan review fee for the "All Other Food Establishments" category and the annual permit fee would be \$155.00, which is half the "Bakery" permit fee. Locations previously permitted by MCESD may qualify for half the "New Permit Application Inspection" fee (\$157.50) in lieu of the plan review fee (\$307.50), which results in savings to the permittee.

Note: The BOS hearing date has been rescheduled to allow for another stakeholder workshop.

Case #/Title: ES-2013-006/Confectionary Food Establishment

Overview: To allow citizens of Maricopa County to prepare not potentially hazardous bakery and confectionary items in a facility for direct consumer sales and for wholesaling to other MCESD permitted food service establishments. The permit definition establishes these food items as an approved food source for sale by other MCESD permitted food establishments.

This proposal creates a new permit (and applicable plan review and permit fees). In addition, the proposal lessens the burden of equipment/infrastructure requirements to qualify for a MCESD permit for the owner that may have begun as a home business and has outgrown the home kitchen.

Case #/Title: ES-2013-009/FDA Food Code Reference Amendment

Overview: Revision to MCEHC Chapter VIII - Updates a MCEHC FDA 2009 Food Code reference to allow registered A.R.S. § 36-136 stakeholders to prepare not potentially hazardous baked and confectionary goods (goods) in a private home kitchen for commercial purposes and to offer these goods for sale in food establishments that have a valid Maricopa County Environmental Services Department permit. No fee changes are requested.
