SERVICES AND FEES



MCACC holds numerous off-site adoption, spay/neuter and vaccination events in various communities throughout the County. Check our website for schedules.

ANIMAL SHELTERING

MCACC has two full-service animal care centers that are open seven days a week where we can receive lost and abandoned pets. Owner relinquishments will be accepted Tuesday through Friday only. MCACC requests that before turning in a pet, you utilize available resources to do what is necessary to keep your pet. MCACC offers low-cost spay/neuter and vaccine programs.

Turn-in Fees:

Owned animals	\$51.00
Stray and feral cats	\$96.00

ADOPTIONS

Looking for a new pet? Consider finding your new best friend at one of MCACC's two shelter locations. Adoption fees range from \$50 - \$150 and include booster shot, spay/neuter surgery, and if over three months of age, a rabies vaccination and one-year license. Check out our website to see if we have any adoption specials going on or to find out when our Mobile Adoption Unit will be in your neighborhood.

LICENSES

It is required by law that your dog wear a collar displaying its current dog license. In addition to the license tag, it is recommended to attach a separate tag which lists your name, current address and telephone number. Licenses need to be renewed every year.

License Fees for Dogs:

Spayed/Neutered \$17.00

Unaltered \$42.00

Senior Discount (65+), altered \$ 6.00 (for up to two dogs per household)

A license is not required by law for your cat, but it is highly recommended that you have an id tag for your cat to place on her collar at all times. Even a cat kept strictly indoors can occasionally get out and become lost.

RABIES VACCINATIONS

It is required by law that dogs be vaccinated for rabies. Cats are not required by law to be rabies vaccinated but it is strongly encouraged.

Rabies Clinic Specials

Rabies vaccinations will be \$20 Sunday afternoons from noon to 4 pm at both shelters, Tuesday and Thursday mornings from 9 am – 11 am at 2500 S. 27th Avenue in Phoenix and Tuesday and Wednesday mornings from 9 am – 11 am at 2630 W. 8th Street in Mesa.

MICROCHIPS

A microchip is a small transmitting device about the size of a grain of wild rice which is injected between the animal's shoulder blades. When an animal's back is swiped with a special scanning device, a number appears on the scanner readout screen. This number is registered along with your name and contact information with the microchip company. It provides an additional way for a lost animal to find its way home.

Microchip Fee: \$25.00
