

LOW VOLTAGE ELECTRICAL SERVICES

1.0 INTENT:

The intent of this Invitation for Bid is to source responsive/responsible contractors to provide comprehensive low voltage electrical repairs, maintenance, and retrofitting for electrical distribution systems up to 600 volts, single and three-phase for the County Facilities Management Department (FMD) or other County departments, at various County owned/leased buildings on as as-needed basis.

The types of equipment the contractor shall be required to perform services on, but not limited to, are: air switches; wire/cable replacement; transformers; switchgear and switchboard assemblies; distribution panels; circuit breakers; grounding systems; panel boards; disconnects; motor control centers; variable speed drives (VFD); emergency and normal electrical power systems; lighting and lighting controls systems; and other associated electrical equipment.

Other County departments may use this contract for electrical services. Facilities Management is not responsible for contract administration for services requested by other County agencies.

Other governmental entities under agreement with the County may have access to services provided hereunder (see also Sections 3.11 and 3.12 below).

The County reserves the right to award in whole or in part, by item or group of items, by section or geographic area, or make multiple awards, where such action serves the County's best interest.

The County reserves the right to add additional contractors, at the County's sole discretion, in cases where the currently listed contractors are of an insufficient number or skill-set to satisfy the County's needs or to ensure adequate competition on any project or task order work.

2.0 SCOPE OF SERVICES:

2.1 TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS:

2.1.1 Types Of Service Work:

2.1.1.1 Low Voltage, 600V AC maximum: Residential/Commercial.

This group shall be for all electrical services under six hundred (600) volts AC. Repairs and services such as, but not limited to: switchboards; panel boards; motor control centers; relay cabinets; emergency power and normal power systems.

2.1.2 Contractor shall be responsible for sourcing all electrical parts/fixtures and equipment necessary in the repair or new installation of electrical systems.

2.1.3 Replacement parts/fixtures shall be OEM and warranted for ninety (90) days, unless longer warranties are available from manufacturers. All parts and electrical equipment provided by Contractor shall be new, except as otherwise stated on the drawings. All parts and electrical equipment shall be UL listed when such standards exist for the type of equipment. All electrical equipment and materials shall be furnished by the Contractor and shall be commercial quality and grade, and be from a regular warrantied product line.

2.1.4 All electrical work shall comply with the requirements of the applicable edition of the National Electric Code and State/Local building codes.

2.1.5 All work by the Contractor shall be subject to inspection and approval by the requesting County agency.

2.1.6 The Contractor shall provide all labor, supervision, transportation, equipment (including testing and all personal protection equipment), tools, and all effort necessary to make the required electrical systems repairs/retrofits, complete and operational.

Machinery/equipment that will be considered as additional cost and used indirectly to the electrical industry for the performance of normal electrical services, such as, but not limited to:

Backhoes
Jackhammers
Concrete cutters
Excavators
Chain hoists
Man lifts (scissor lifts, fork lifts, boom lifts, bucket trucks, etc.)

These items (and other approved equipment), if rented from a rental contractor, will be allowed the rental charge plus an administrative mark-up cost not to exceed five percent (5%). If owned, the equipment shall be charged per the bid rate in the pricing section.

2.1.7 Contractor shall coordinate all repair/installation schedules with FMD (or other County requesting agencies) before beginning work. All electrical connections requiring a power outage, shall be made during an approved time limit, and must be coordinated by FMD or the requesting County agency's staff.

2.1.8 Project Work and Time and Materials:

2.1.8.1 Project work shall mean "work performed on major projects or major repairs to facilities". Each of the contractors assigned to this contract shall be provided a request for project quote with a detailed Scope of Work. As such, each contractor MUST submit a response, with award to the lowest pre-tax quote of the project. Contractors are not to submit their own project quote sheets. Only County letterhead quote sheets are acceptable. All terms and conditions are those established under this agreement. All additional labor charges outside the Scope of Work are those established in the pricing section.

(A) The threshold for time and materials to project work shall be \$5,000.00. Exceptions to this shall be emergencies that arise and must be dealt with immediately without the time for project quotes. This figure is not firm fixed. The County reserves the right to adjust this figure to a higher-level if deemed in the best interest of the department.

2.1.8.2 After site review of the project, all contractors shall submit the project quote sheet back to the requestor, either with acceptance and a firm price; or decline with a written reason as to why the project was declined. Contractors who have declined project work a minimum of three times during a six-month period may be required to attend a meeting with the Office of Procurement Services and FMD to discuss consideration for default of contract as this is indicative of the Contractor's desire not to do business with the County.

2.1.8.3 The submitted project price quote shall be inclusive. That is, any cost overruns to be absorbed by the Contractor, or cost savings to be additional profit. Exceptions to this are changes requested by the County that incur higher project cost and longer delays. All change orders to a project must be in writing, referencing the contract serial number, and approved by FMD (or County user agency if request was made by them) prior to any authorization to proceed. The Contractor who fails to acquire change orders in writing runs the risk of incurring these additional costs without payment.

Project pricing shall include everything the contractor anticipates is necessary to complete the job (i.e., rental equipment, materials, labor, supervision, subcontractor costs, mobilization costs, demobilization costs, permits, etc.).

These costs are to be part of the overall project price, and as such not be itemized.

2.1.8.4 Dependent on the complexity/nature of the project, a predetermined and/or pre-identified mandatory site meeting may be held to ensure all contractors are aware of important issues regarding the project. Mandatory site meetings will require a sign-in sheet. Contractors who do not show-up to a mandatory site meeting and who submit a project quote will be considered “non-responsive”.

2.1.8.5 Contractors shall be compensated for additional work requested that is not detailed in the scope via the labor rates bid in the pricing section. Note: all extra work outside the S-O-W must be in writing.

2.1.8.6 This contract may also be used for time and materials work (not to exceed \$5,000) and priced per hour as bid in the pricing section. Each bidder shall be ranked as first call, second call, or third call. The contractor of record having the lowest labor bid shall be called first by the requesting department for time and materials service. If the vendor is unable to respond within the time parameters, the requesting agency shall proceed to the next call vendor. Consistent decline of service requests by a vendor or continued non-compliance with response time specifications shall cause the County to review the file and make a determination for default of contract.

2.1.9 **CONTRACTOR QUALIFICATIONS:**

2.1.9.1 The Contractor must have a current and active K11 or L11 license issued by the State of Arizona Registrar of Contractors. Proof of such must accompany the bid package.

2.1.9.2 Contractor’s firm must be in the electrical services business a minimum of five (5) consecutive years. Electrical services to include repair and service work in low voltage (600 volts or less) Commercial/Industrial systems, of low voltage systems Industrial repair, and be completely familiar with the specified requirements and methods needed for proper performance of this contract. Electricians assigned to this contract must have a minimum of five (5) years’ experience to perform any electrical service to the County. Proof of these requirements must accompany bid package.

2.1.9.3 The Contractors service truck fleet shall carry sufficient supply of repair parts and equipment to perform routine electrical service and repairs. The Contractor shall have a local shop and/or warehouse that stock parts to keep their trucks supplied daily. These requirements may be verified by FMD via a formal inspection after bid submittals, and prior to bid award.

2.1.10 **CONTRACTOR REQUIREMENTS:**

2.1.10.1 All service work performed by Contractor shall be held to a professional standard, performed in a neat and workmanship manner, meeting all required state and municipal building codes, and is susceptible to FMD (or other using agencies) staff inspection and approval.

2.1.10.2 It is the Contractor’s responsibility to inform FMD (or other using agencies) on any updates to any worked on electrical panel; therefore, the Contractor shall label and identify all electrical components and shall put the newly updated panel schedule(s) inside the worked on electrical panel. The new schedule will be dated with the time of the update (MM/DD/YYYY) and the existing schedule is to remain in the panel behind the new schedule.

- 2.1.10.3 The Contractor shall make necessary repairs to in such a manner that does not damage County property. In the event damage occurs to Maricopa County property, or any adjacent property by reason of any repairs or installations performed under this Contract, the Contractor shall replace or repair the same at no cost to the County. If damage caused by the Contractor has to be repaired or replaced by the County, the cost of such work shall be passed on to the Contractor.
- 2.1.10.4 The Contractor shall ensure all trash generated by the work performed (either repairs, retrofitting or new installations) shall be removed from the site in a timely manner. Additionally, the Contractor shall ensure that any/all disturbances to the areas where the Contractor performed work are restored to the same condition found prior to start of the work. Such disturbances may include, but not limited to: loose dirt, dislocated gravel; removed vegetation; footprints; old asphalt/concrete; ceiling tile dust and particles, core drilling dust, items that may pose hazardous situations (trip hazards), etc. If an inspection reveals that the Contractor fails to clean up after work has been performed, The County will notify the Contractor of the discrepancy and the Contractor will have twenty-four (24) hours to make the needed correction. Should the Contractor still fail to clean the area, the County reserves the right to make other arrangements to have the area cleaned and the cost of such work shall be passed on to the Contractor.
- 2.1.10.5 In the event the work performance of the Contractor is unsatisfactory, the Contractor will be notified by the County and will be given twenty-four (24) hours to correct the work. Labor for all re-work will be at no cost to the County.
- 2.1.10.6 A background check will be a requirement for all employees of Contractor's staff providing services to the County. This option shall allow the Contractor to access areas within the County such as detention facilities, court buildings, and other restricted areas. The cost of this service shall be incurred by the County.
- 2.1.10.7 The Contractor shall submit with its bid Attachment D indicating that they have read and will comply with Maricopa County Internal Policy. Policy A2234 Section U, Injury and Illness Prevention Plan: Non-Construction Contractor Safety Management Policy Attachment D.
- 2.1.10.8 Technical Training to County Staff:

The Contractor(s) shall be required to provide technical expertise training for low voltage services. These training sessions will be on-request by applicable County agencies. The training requested may be for old or new technology. The training will be held at a County facility, or if deemed necessary, the Contractors facility. Training aids (i.e., service manuals, mock-up equipment; etc.) shall be provided by the Contractor. The County under a separate purchase order may purchase Service manuals. The Contractor shall be given advance notice to prepare, research, and schedule staff in order to provide an adequate presentation. The cost of this service will be line item priced in the pricing section of the contract. Exceptions: equipment units purchased under project work will be specified in the job scope to include training. Technical training shall be performed during regular business hours.

3.0 PURCHASING REQUIREMENTS:

3.1 ACCEPTANCE:

Upon delivery and successful installation, the material(s) shall be deemed accepted and the warranty period shall begin. All documentation shall be completed prior to final acceptance.

3.2 FACILITIES:

During the course of this Contract, the County shall provide the Contractor's personnel with adequate workspace for consultants and such other related facilities as may be required by Contractor to carry out its obligation enumerated herein.

3.3 FACTORY AUTHORIZED SERVICE AVAILABILITY:

The Contractor shall have and maintain a local factory authorized service facility within the Phoenix, Arizona metropolitan area. The facility shall be capable of supplying and installing component parts, troubleshooting, repairing and maintaining the material(s). Minimum service hours shall be from 6:00 A.M. through 6:00 P.M., Arizona Time, Monday through Friday.

3.4 USAGE REPORT:

The Contractor shall furnish the County a usage report upon request delineating the acquisition activity governed by the Contract. The format of the report shall be approved by the County and shall disclose the quantity and dollar value of each contract item by individual unit.

3.5 BACKGROUND CHECK:

Bidders/proposers need to be aware that there may be multiple background checks (Sheriff's Office, County Attorney's Office, Courts as well as Maricopa County general government) to determine if the respondent is acceptable to do business with the County. This applies to (but is not limited to) the company, sub-contractors and employees and the failure to pass these checks shall deem the respondent non-responsible.

3.6 INVOICES AND PAYMENTS:

3.6.1 The Contractor shall submit one (1) legible copy of their detailed invoice before payment(s) can be made. Incomplete invoices will not be processed. At a minimum, the invoice must provide the following information:

- Company name, address and contact information
- County bill-to name and contact/requestor information
- Building Name and Building Number
- County purchase order number
- County contract number
- Maximo (FMD) service call number
- Invoice number and date
- Date of service or delivery
- Description of Purchase (services performed)
- Labor breakdown: rate per hour x no. of hours by personnel type (time & materials)
- Material breakdown: itemized parts list to contain unit price x quantity, indicating mark-ups as contracted (time & materials)
- Arrival and completion time
- Total Amount Due with tax amounts separated. Must also clearly indicate the tax rate being applied
- Payment Terms

- 3.6.2 Discounts offered in the contract shall be calculated based on the date a properly completed invoice is received by the County (ROI).
- 3.6.3 Problems regarding billing or invoicing shall be directed to the using agency as listed on the Purchase Order.
- 3.6.4 Payment shall be made to the Contractor by Accounts Payable through the Maricopa County Vendor Express Payment Program. This is an Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) process. After Contract Award the Contractor shall complete the Vendor Registration Form located on the County Department of Finance Vendor Registration Web Site (<http://www.maricopa.gov/Finance/Vendors.aspx>).
- 3.6.5 EFT payments to the routing and account numbers designated by the Contractor will include the details on the specific invoices that the payment covers. The Contractor is required to discuss remittance delivery capabilities with their designated financial institution for access to those details.

3.7 APPLICABLE TAXES:

- 3.7.1 **Payment of Taxes:** The Contractor shall pay all applicable taxes. With respect to any installation labor on items that are not attached to real property performed by Contractor under the terms of this Contract, the installation labor cost and the gross receipts for materials provided shall be listed separately on the Contractor's invoices.
- 3.7.2 **State and Local Transaction Privilege Taxes:** Maricopa County is subject to all applicable state and local transaction privilege taxes. To the extent any state and local transaction privilege taxes apply to sales made under the terms of this contract_it is the responsibility of the seller to collect and remit all applicable taxes to the proper taxing jurisdiction of authority.
- 3.7.3 **Tax Indemnification:** Contractor and all subcontractors shall pay all Federal, state, and local taxes applicable to its operation and any persons employed by the Contractor. Contractor shall, and require all subcontractors to hold Maricopa County harmless from any responsibility for taxes, damages and interest, if applicable, contributions required under Federal, and/or state and local laws and regulations and any other costs including transaction privilege taxes, unemployment compensation insurance, Social Security and Worker's Compensation.

3.8 TAX: (SERVICES)

No tax shall be levied against labor. It is the responsibility of the Contractor to determine any and all taxes and include the same in proposal price.

3.9 DELIVERY:

It shall be the Contractor's responsibility to meet the proposed delivery requirements. Maricopa County reserves the right to obtain services on the open market in the event the Contractor fails to make delivery and any price differential will be charged against the Contractor.

3.10 POST AWARD MEETING:

The Contractor may be required to attend a post-award meeting with the Using Agency to discuss the terms and conditions of this Contract. This meeting will be coordinated by the Procurement Officer of the Contract.

3.11 STRATEGIC ALLIANCE for VOLUME EXPENDITURES (\$AVE):

The County is a member of the \$AVE cooperative purchasing group. \$AVE includes the State of Arizona, many Phoenix metropolitan area municipalities, and many K-12 unified school districts.

Under the \$AVE Cooperative Purchasing Agreement, and with the concurrence of the successful Respondent under this solicitation, a member of \$AVE may access a contract resulting from a solicitation issued by the County. If you **do not** want to grant such access to a member of \$AVE, **please so state** in your proposal. In the absence of a statement to the contrary, the County will assume that you do wish to grant access to any contract that may result from this Request for Proposal.

3.12 INTERGOVERNMENTAL COOPERATIVE PURCHASING AGREEMENTS (ICPA's):

County currently holds ICPA's with numerous governmental entities throughout the State of Arizona. These agreements allow those entities, with the approval of the Contractor, to purchase their requirements under the terms and conditions of the County Contract. Please indicate on Attachment A, your acceptance or rejection regarding such participation of other governmental entities. Your response will not be considered as an evaluation factor in awarding a contract.

4.0 CONTRACTUAL TERMS & CONDITIONS:

4.1 CONTRACT TERM:

This Invitation for Bid is for awarding a firm, fixed-price purchasing contract to cover a term of ~~three (3)~~ **one (1)** year.

4.2 OPTION TO RENEW:

The County may, at its option and with the concurrence of the Contractor, renew the term of this Contract up to a maximum of ~~three (3)~~ **five (5)** additional years, (or at the County's sole discretion, extend the contract on a month to month basis for a maximum of six (6) months after expiration). The Contractor shall be notified in writing by the Office of Procurement Services of the County's intention to renew the contract term at least thirty (60) calendar days prior to the expiration of the original contract term..

4.3 PRICE ADJUSTMENTS:

Any requests for reasonable price adjustments must be submitted sixty (60) days prior to the Contract expiration date. Requests for adjustment in cost of labor and/or materials must be supported by appropriate documentation. If County agrees to the adjusted price terms, County shall issue written approval of the change. The reasonableness of the request will be determined by comparing the request with the Consumer Price Index or by performing a market survey.

4.4 INDEMNIFICATION:

To the fullest extent permitted by law, and to the extent that claims, damages, losses or expenses are not covered and paid by insurance purchased by the Contractor, the Contractor shall defend indemnify and hold harmless the County (as Owner), its agents, representatives, agents, officers, directors, officials, and employees from and against all claims, damages, losses, and expenses (including, but not limited to attorneys' fees, court costs, expert witness fees, and the costs and attorneys' fees for appellate proceedings) arising out of, or alleged to have resulted from the negligent acts, errors, omissions, or mistakes relating to the performance of this Contract.

Contractor's duty to defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the County, its agents, representatives, agents, officers, directors, officials, and employees shall arise in connection with any claim, damage, loss, or expense that is attributable to bodily injury, sickness, disease, death or injury to, impairment of, or destruction of tangible property, including loss of use resulting there from, caused by negligent acts, errors, omissions, or mistakes in the performance of this Contract, but only to the extent caused by the negligent acts or omissions of the Contractor, a subcontractor, any one directly or indirectly employed by them, or anyone for whose acts they may be liable, regardless of whether or not such claim, damage, loss, or expense is caused in part by a party indemnified hereunder.

The amount and type of insurance coverage requirements set forth herein will in no way be construed as limiting the scope of the indemnity in this paragraph.

The scope of this indemnification does not extend to the sole negligence of County.

4.5 INSURANCE:

4.5.1 Contractor, at Contractor's own expense, shall purchase and maintain the herein stipulated minimum insurance from a company or companies duly licensed by the State of Arizona and possessing a current A.M. Best, Inc. rating of B++. In lieu of State of Arizona licensing, the stipulated insurance may be purchased from a company or companies, which are authorized to do business in the State of Arizona, provided that said insurance companies meet the approval of County. The form of any insurance policies and forms must be acceptable to County.

4.5.2 All insurance required herein shall be maintained in full force and effect until all work or service required to be performed under the terms of the Contract is satisfactorily completed and formally accepted. Failure to do so may, at the sole discretion of County, constitute a material breach of this Contract.

4.5.3 Contractor's insurance shall be primary insurance as respects County, and any insurance or self-insurance maintained by County shall not contribute to it.

4.5.4 Any failure to comply with the claim reporting provisions of the insurance policies or any breach of an insurance policy warranty shall not affect the County's right to coverage afforded under the insurance policies.

4.5.5 The insurance policies may provide coverage that contains deductibles or self-insured retentions. Such deductible and/or self-insured retentions shall not be applicable with respect to the coverage provided to County under such policies. Contractor shall be solely responsible for the deductible and/or self-insured retention and County, at its option, may require Contractor to secure payment of such deductibles or self-insured retentions by a surety bond or an irrevocable and unconditional letter of credit.

4.5.6 The insurance policies required by this Contract, except Workers' Compensation and Errors and Omissions, shall name County, its agents, representatives, officers, directors, officials and employees as Additional Insureds.

4.5.7 The policies required hereunder, except Workers' Compensation and Errors and Omissions, shall contain a waiver of transfer of rights of recovery (subrogation) against County, its agents, representatives, officers, directors, officials and employees for any claims arising out of Contractor's work or service.

4.5.8 Commercial General Liability:

Commercial General Liability insurance and, if necessary, Commercial Umbrella insurance with a limit of not less than \$2,000,000 for each occurrence, \$4,000,000 Products/Completed Operations Aggregate, and \$4,000,000 General Aggregate Limit. The policy shall include coverage for premises liability, bodily injury, broad form property damage, personal injury, products and completed operations and blanket contractual coverage, and shall not contain any provisions which would serve to limit third party action over claims. There shall be no endorsement or modifications of the CGL limiting the scope of coverage for liability arising from explosion, collapse, or underground property damage.

4.5.9 Automobile Liability:

Commercial/Business Automobile Liability insurance and, if necessary, Commercial Umbrella insurance with a combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage

of not less than \$1,000,000 each occurrence with respect to any of the Contractor's owned, hired, and non-owned vehicles assigned to or used in performance of the Contractor's work or services or use or maintenance of the Premises under this Contract.

4.5.10 Workers' Compensation:

Workers' Compensation insurance to cover obligations imposed by federal and state statutes having jurisdiction of Contractor's employees engaged in the performance of the work or services under this Contract; and Employer's Liability insurance of not less than \$1,000,000 for each accident, \$1,000,000 disease for each employee, and \$1,000,000 disease policy limit.

Contractor, its contractors and its subcontractors waive all rights against Contract and its agents, officers, directors and employees for recovery of damages to the extent these damages are covered by the Workers' Compensation and Employer's Liability or commercial umbrella liability insurance obtained by Contractor, its contractors and its subcontractors pursuant to this Contract.

4.5.11 Certificates of Insurance:

4.5.11.1 Prior to Contract **AWARD**, Contractor shall furnish the County with valid and complete certificates of insurance, or formal endorsements as required by the Contract in the form provided by the County, issued by Contractor's insurer(s), as evidence that policies providing the required coverage, conditions and limits required by this Contract are in full force and effect. Such certificates shall identify this contract number and title.

4.5.11.2 In the event any insurance policy (ies) required by this contract is (are) written on a "claims made" basis, coverage shall extend for two years past completion and acceptance of Contractor's work or services and as evidenced by annual Certificates of Insurance.

4.5.11.3 If a policy does expire during the life of the Contract, a renewal certificate must be sent to County fifteen (15) days prior to the expiration date.

4.5.12 Cancellation and Expiration Notice:

Applicable to all insurance policies required within the Insurance Requirements of this Contract, Contractor's insurance shall not be permitted to expire, be suspended, be canceled, or be materially changed for any reason without thirty (30) days prior written notice to Maricopa County. Contractor must provide to Maricopa County, within 2 business days of receipt, if they receive notice of a policy that has been or will be suspended, canceled, materially changed for any reason, has expired, or will be expiring. Such notice shall be sent directly to Maricopa County Office of Procurement Services and shall be mailed, emailed, hand delivered or sent by facsimile transmission to (320 West Lincoln Street, Phoenix, AZ 85003, Phone Number 602/506-3967 /Fax Number 602/258-1573).

4.6 ORDERING AUTHORITY:

4.6.1 Any request for purchase of product(s) shall be accompanied by a valid purchase order, issued by Office of Procurement Services, a Purchase Order issued by the using Department or direction by a Certified Agency Procurement Aid (CAPA) with a Purchase Card for payment.

4.7 REQUIREMENTS CONTRACT:

4.7.1 Contractors signify their understanding and agreement by signing a bid submittal, that the Contract resulting from the bid is a requirements contract. However, the Contract does

not guarantee any minimum or maximum number of purchases will be made. It only indicates that if purchases are made for the materials contained in the Contract, they will be purchased from the Contractor awarded that item. Orders will only be placed when the County identifies a need and proper authorization and documentation have been approved.

4.7.2 County reserves the right to cancel Purchase Orders within a reasonable period of time after issuance. Should a Purchase Order be canceled, the County agrees to reimburse the Contractor for actual and documentable costs incurred by the Contractor in response to the Purchase Order. The County will not reimburse the Contractor for any costs incurred after receipt of County notice of cancellation, or for lost profits, shipment of product prior to issuance of Purchase Order, etc.

4.7.3 Contractors agree to accept verbal notification of cancellation of Purchase Orders from the County Procurement Officer with written notification to follow. By submitting a bid in response to this Invitation for Bids, the Contractor specifically acknowledges to be bound by this cancellation policy.

4.8 **SUSPENSION OF WORK:**

The Procurement Officer may order the Contractor, in writing, to suspend, delay, or interrupt all or any part of the work of this contract for the period of time that the Procurement Officer determines appropriate for the convenience of the County. No adjustment shall be made under this clause for any suspension, delay, or interruption to the extent that performance would have been so suspended, delayed, or interrupted by any other cause, including the fault or negligence of the Contractor. No request for adjustment under this clause shall be granted unless the claim, in an amount stated, is asserted in writing as soon as practicable after the termination of the suspension, delay, or interruption, but not later than the date of final payment under the contract.

4.9 **STOP WORK ORDER:**

The Procurement Officer may, at any time, by written order to the Contractor, require the Contractor to stop all, or any part, of the work called for by this contract for a period of 90 days after the order is delivered to the Contractor, and for any further period to which the parties may agree. The order shall be specifically identified as a stop work order issued under this clause. Upon receipt of the order, the Contractor shall immediately comply with its terms and take all reasonable steps to minimize the incurrence of costs allocable to the work covered by the order during the period of work stoppage. Within a period of 90 days after a stop-work is delivered to the Contractor, or within any extension of that period to which the parties shall have agreed, the Procurement Officer shall either—

4.9.1 Cancel the stop-work order; or

4.9.2 Terminate the work covered by the order as provided in the Default, or the Termination for Convenience of the County, clause of this contract.

4.9.3 The Procurement Officer may make an equitable adjustment in the delivery schedule and/or contract price, or otherwise, and the contract shall be modified, in writing, accordingly, if the Contractor demonstrates that the stop work order resulted in an increase in costs to the Contractor.

4.10 **UNCONDITIONAL TERMINATION FOR CONVENIENCE:**

Maricopa County may terminate the resultant Contract for convenience by providing sixty (60) calendar days advance notice to the Contractor.

4.11 TERMINATION FOR DEFAULT:

The County may, by written notice of default to the Contractor, terminate this contract in whole or in part if the Contractor fails to:

- 4.11.1 Deliver the supplies or to perform the services within the time specified in this contract or any extension;
- 4.11.2 Make progress, so as to endanger performance of this contract; or
- 4.11.3 Perform any of the other provisions of this contract.
- 4.11.4 The County's right to terminate this contract under these subparagraphs may be exercised if the Contractor does not cure such failure within 10 days (or more if authorized in writing by the County) after receipt of the notice from the Procurement Officer specifying the failure.

4.12 STATUTORY RIGHT OF CANCELLATION FOR CONFLICT OF INTEREST:

Notice is given that pursuant to A.R.S. § 38-511 the County may cancel any Contract without penalty or further obligation within three years after execution of the contract, if any person significantly involved in initiating, negotiating, securing, drafting or creating the contract on behalf of the County is at any time while the Contract or any extension of the Contract is in effect, an employee or agent of any other party to the Contract in any capacity or consultant to any other party of the Contract with respect to the subject matter of the Contract. Additionally, pursuant to A.R.S § 38-511 the County may recoup any fee or commission paid or due to any person significantly involved in initiating, negotiating, securing, drafting or creating the contract on behalf of the County from any other party to the contract arising as the result of the Contract.

4.13 OFFSET FOR DAMAGES:

In addition to all other remedies at Law or Equity, the County may offset from any money due to the Contractor any amounts Contractor owes to the County for damages resulting from breach or deficiencies in performance of the contract.

4.14 SUBCONTRACTING:

- 4.14.1 The Contractor may not assign to another Contractor or Subcontract to another party for performance of the terms and conditions hereof without the written consent of the County. All correspondence authorizing subcontracting must reference the Bid Serial Number and identify the job project.
- 4.14.2 The Subcontractor's rate for the job shall not exceed that of the Prime Contractor's rate, as bid in the pricing section, unless the Prime Contractor is willing to absorb any higher rates. The Subcontractor's invoice shall be invoiced directly to the Prime Contractor, who in turn shall pass-through the costs to the County, without mark-up. A copy of the Subcontractor's invoice must accompany the Prime Contractor's invoice.

4.15 AMENDMENTS:

All amendments to this Contract shall be in writing and approved/signed by both parties. Maricopa County Office of Procurement Services shall be responsible for approving all amendments for Maricopa County.

4.16 ADDITIONS/DELETIONS OF SERVICE:

The County reserves the right to add and/or delete materials to a Contract. If a service requirement is deleted, payment to the Contractor will be reduced proportionately, to the amount

of service reduced in accordance with the bid price. If additional materials are required from a Contract, prices for such additions will be negotiated between the Contractor and the County.

4.17 ACCESS TO AND RETENTION OF RECORDS FOR THE PURPOSE OF AUDIT AND/OR OTHER REVIEW:

4.17.1 In accordance with section MCI 371 of the Maricopa County Procurement Code the Contractor agrees to retain all books, records, accounts, statements, reports, files, and other records and back-up documentation relevant to this Contract for six (6) years after final payment or until after the resolution of any audit questions which could be more than six (6) years, whichever is latest. The County, Federal or State auditors and any other persons duly authorized by the Department shall have full access to, and the right to examine, copy and make use of, any and all said materials.

4.17.2 If the Contractor's books, records, accounts, statements, reports, files, and other records and back-up documentation relevant to this Contract are not sufficient to support and document that requested services were provided, the Contractor shall reimburse Maricopa County for the services not so adequately supported and documented.

4.17.3 If at any time it is determined by the County that a cost for which payment has been made is a disallowed cost, the County shall notify the Contractor in writing of the disallowance. The course of action to address the disallowance shall be at sole discretion of the County, and may include either an adjustment to future invoices, request for credit, request for a check or deduction from current billings submitted by the Contractor by the amount of the disallowance, or to require reimbursement forthwith of the disallowed amount by the Contractor by issuing a check payable to Maricopa County.

4.18 VALIDITY:

The invalidity, in whole or in part, of any provision of this Contract shall not void or affect the validity of any other provision of the Contract.

4.19 RIGHTS IN DATA:

The County shall have the use of data and reports resulting from a Contract without additional cost or other restriction except as may be established by law or applicable regulation. Each party shall supply to the other party, upon request, any available information that is relevant to a Contract and to the performance thereunder.

4.20 RELATIONSHIPS:

4.20.1 In the performance of the services described herein, the Contractor shall act solely as an independent contractor, and nothing herein or implied herein shall at any time be construed as to create the relationship of employer and employee, co-employee, partnership, principal and agent, or joint venture between the County and the Contractor.

4.20.2 The County reserves the right of final approval on proposed staff for all Task Orders. Also, upon request by the County, the Contractor will be required to remove any employees working on County projects and substitute personnel based on the discretion of the County within two business days, unless previously approved by the County.

4.21 NON-DISCRIMINATION:

CONTRACTOR agrees to comply with all provisions and requirements of Arizona Executive Order 2009-09 including flow down of all provisions and requirements to any subcontractors. Executive Order 2009-09 supersedes Executive order 99-4 and amends Executive order 75-5 and may be viewed and downloaded at the Governor of the State of Arizona's website <http://azmemory.azlibrary.gov/cdm/singleitem/collection/execorders/id/680/rec/1> which is hereby incorporated into this contract as if set forth in full herein. During the performance of this contract,

CONTRACTOR shall not discriminate against any employee, client or any other individual in any way because of that person's age, race, creed, color, religion, sex, disability or national origin.

4.22 CERTIFICATION REGARDING DEBARMENT AND SUSPENSION:

4.22.1 The undersigned (authorized official signing for the Contractor) certifies to the best of his or her knowledge and belief, that the Contractor

4.22.1.1 is not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from covered transactions by any Federal Department or agency;

4.22.1.2 have not within 3-year period preceding this Contract been convicted of or had a civil judgment rendered against them for commission of fraud or a criminal offense in connection with obtaining, attempting to obtain, or performing a public (Federal, State or local) transaction or contract under a public transaction; violation of Federal or State antitrust statutes or commission of embezzlement, theft, forgery, bribery, falsification or destruction of records, making false statements, or receiving stolen property;

4.22.1.3 are not presently indicted or otherwise criminally or civilly charged by a government entity (Federal, State or local) with commission of any of the offenses enumerated in paragraph (2) of this certification; and

4.22.1.4 have not within a 3-year period preceding this Contract had one or more public transaction (Federal, State or local) terminated for cause of default.

4.22.2 The Contractor agrees to include, without modification, this clause in all lower tier covered transactions (i.e. transactions with subcontractors) and in all solicitations for lower tier covered transactions related to this Contract.

4.23 VERIFICATION REGARDING COMPLIANCE WITH ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES §41-4401 AND FEDERAL IMMIGRATION LAWS AND REGULATIONS:

4.23.1 By entering into the Contract, the Contractor warrants compliance with the Immigration and Nationality Act (INA using e-verify) and all other federal immigration laws and regulations related to the immigration status of its employees and A.R.S. §23-214(A). The contractor shall obtain statements from its subcontractors certifying compliance and shall furnish the statements to the Procurement Officer upon request. These warranties shall remain in effect through the term of the Contract. The Contractor and its subcontractors shall also maintain Employment Eligibility Verification forms (I-9) as required by the Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986, as amended from time to time, for all employees performing work under the Contract and verify employee compliance using the E-verify system and shall keep a record of the verification for the duration of the employee's employment or at least three years, whichever is longer. I-9 forms are available for download at USCIS.GOV.

4.23.2 The County retains the legal right to inspect contractor and subcontractor employee documents performing work under this Contract to verify compliance with paragraph 4.23.1 of this Section. Contractor and subcontractor shall be given reasonable notice of the County's intent to inspect and shall make the documents available at the time and date specified. Should the County suspect or find that the Contractor or any of its subcontractors are not in compliance, the County will consider this a material breach of the contract and may pursue any and all remedies allowed by law, including, but not limited to: suspension of work, termination of the Contract for default, and suspension and/or debarment of the Contractor. All costs necessary to verify compliance are the responsibility of the Contractor.

4.24 CONTRACTOR LICENSE REQUIREMENT:

4.24.1 The Respondent shall procure all permits, insurance, licenses and pay the charges and fees necessary and incidental to the lawful conduct of his/her business, and as necessary complete any required certification requirements, required by any and all governmental or non-governmental entities as mandated to maintain compliance with and in good standing for all permits and/or licenses. The Respondent shall keep fully informed of existing and future trade or industry requirements, Federal, State and Local laws, ordinances, and regulations which in any manner affect the fulfillment of a Contract and shall comply with the same. Contractor shall immediately notify both Office of Procurement Services and the using agency of any and all changes concerning permits, insurance or licenses.

4.24.2 Respondents furnishing finished products, materials or articles of merchandise that will require installation or attachment as part of the Contract, shall possess any licenses required. A Respondent is not relieved of its obligation to possess the required licenses by subcontracting of the labor portion of the Contract. Respondents are advised to contact the Arizona Registrar of Contractors, Chief of Licensing, at (602) 542-1525 to ascertain licensing requirements for a particular contract. Respondents shall identify which license(s), if any, the Registrar of Contractors requires for performance of the Contract.

4.25 INFLUENCE:

As prescribed in MC1-1202 of the Maricopa County Procurement Code, any effort to influence an employee or agent to breach the Maricopa County Ethical Code of Conduct or any ethical conduct, may be grounds for Disbarment or Suspension under MC1-902.

An attempt to influence includes, but is not limited to:

4.25.1 A Person offering or providing a gratuity, gift, tip, present, donation, money, entertainment or educational passes or tickets, or any type valuable contribution or subsidy,

4.25.2 That is offered or given with the intent to influence a decision, obtain a contract, garner favorable treatment, or gain favorable consideration of any kind.

If a Person attempts to influence any employee or agent of Maricopa County, the Chief Procurement Officer, or his designee, reserves the right to seek any remedy provided by the Maricopa County Procurement Code, any remedy in equity or in the law, or any remedy provided by this contract.

4.26 PUBLIC RECORDS:

All Offers submitted and opened are public records and must be retained by the Records Manager at the Office of Procurement Services. Offers shall be open to public inspection after Contract award and execution, except for such Offers deemed to be confidential by the Office of Procurement Services. If an Offeror believes that information in its Offer should remain confidential, it shall indicate as confidential, the specific information in its offer and submit a statement with its offer detailing the reasons that the information should not be disclosed. Such reasons shall include the specific harm or prejudice which may arise. The Records Manager of the Office of Procurement Services shall determine whether the identified information is confidential pursuant to the Maricopa County Procurement Code and the Arizona Public Records Law.
