### ***CRIMINAL JUSTICE SYSTEM NEWS – MAY 2007***

#### **Adult Incarceration**

**Bookings increased** from April's 11,083 to May's 11,342 (the most bookings ever). The **Average Daily Population increased** from 8,966 to 9,264. However, ADP is still down 9.0% when compared to the same time period last Fiscal Year. The **pretrial and hold populations increased** in May compared to April: pretrial from 5,886 to 6,162 and holds from 327 to 352 (the most since October 2006 – 366). The **sentenced population remained nearly the same** at 2,703. The pretrial population was 67% of the overall jail population in May. Although the percentage has been steadily rising and has been 66% for the last two months, May's 67% is the highest ever.

**Overall ALOS slightly increased one day** from 24.3 to 25.3 days. ALOS is down 10.2% when compared to the same time period last Fiscal Year. **The ALOS for agency holds decreased slightly** from 61.9 to 61.1 days. **Pretrial ALOS decreased** from 8.1 to 6.2 days. **Sentenced ALOS remained the same** at 26 days (this is the lowest sentenced ALOS since April 2004 – 22.3 days).

The percentage of inmates held for Federal agencies (including Immigration and Customs Enforcement) in May was the highest ever. The percentage has been steadily increasing since November 2006 – 15%; in December 2006 – 17%; January 2007 – 18%; February – 19%; March – 20%; April – 25%; May – 28%.

Transportation numbers have been steady, averaging 11,598 inmates transported each month the first four months of 2007. However, the number increased dramatically in May, from April's 12,135 to May's 14,519.

#### **Superior Court Filings & Case Processing**

**Criminal filings were over 3,800 for the first time ever in May** (3,802 compared to April's 3,148). **Terminations decreased** from 2,928 to 2,828. The resulting clearance rate was 74.4% (lowest since August 2003 – 69.0%). **The active pending case inventory increased** from 10,649 to 10,905 (most since January 2006 – 11,029). **Filings into RCC and EDC increased in May compared to April:** RCC filings from 1,918 to 2,375, EDC filings from 963 to 1,217. **80 trials were completed in May** compared to April's 76. **The May trial rate was 2.1%**, a decrease from April's 2.4% (lowest since December 2006 – 1.8%).

#### **Justice Court Filings**

**All traffic filings increased** from April to May: DUIs from 742 to 951; all other criminal traffic from 5,113 to 6,480; civil traffic from 9,219 to 13,489. Overall, May's total filings were 37,564 compared to April's 31,027.

#### **Adult Probation**

**General and intensive pretrial supervision decreased** from April to May: general from 652 to 624; intensive from 996 to 951. **Electronic monitoring increased** from 239 to 244.


**Levels of standard and intensive probation supervision decreased:** standard from 30,424 to 30,197; intensive from 1,215 to 1,180 (this is the lowest level since February 2004 – 1,169).

#### **Juvenile Detention and Probation**


The **Average Daily Detention Population increased** from 379 in April to 395 in May. ADP is down 6.5% when compared to the same time period last Fiscal Year. **ALOS increased** from 14.9 to 15.6 days. ALOS is down 7.3% when compared to the same time period last Fiscal Year. **Electronic Monitoring increased by one** to May's 160. **Home detention increased** from 249 in April to 262 in May.

**Levels of juvenile standard and intensive probation increased:** standard from 4,305 to 4,385 and intensive from 521 to 532.


# Jail Bookings




# Average Daily Jail Population



# Average Daily Jail Population by Type




# Average Length of Stay in Jail for Agency Holds




# Average Length of Stay in Jail Pretrial vs Sentenced Population



# Average Length of Stay in Jail for Pretrial Inmates




# Sheriff's Office Transports for Inmate Court Appearances







# Direct Complaints into Superior Court




# Grand Jury Indictments




# Superior Court Trials Completed




# Active Pending Criminal Case Inventory





# Pretrial Supervision Defendant Monitoring Unit




# Pretrial Supervision Defendants on Electronic Monitoring




# Disposition of Cases Terminated

Average monthly dispositions by quarter



# Status of Cases After 180 Days




# Adult Probation Standard Supervision Population




# Adult Probation Intensive Supervision Population




# Juvenile Detention Average Daily Population



# Juvenile Detention Average Length of Stay




# Juvenile Electronic Monitoring
