COVID-19 in Arizona and US




ARIZONA

- 228,748 cases (+5,347 in past week)
 - Confirmed and probable
 - Case counts are on the rise
- 5,789 deaths

- 215,194 Total Deaths
- 359,835 Cases in Last 7 Days


COVID-19 in Maricopa County



- 147,964 cases in Maricopa
 - Confirmed + probable
 - +3,239 from last week
- 19,061 – 0-19 years
- 3,487 (2%) deaths

Maricopa County has received **147,964** confirmed and probable COVID-19 cases.

This number is likely to increase as there is a 6 day reporting delay from when specimens were collected.



Lab Testing Data – Maricopa County









Diagnostic tests by date of collection




Diagnostic Testing by Age Group


Schools Outbreak Dashboard




Since August, 23 schools have had an outbreak of COVID-19.

An outbreak of COVID-19 in a school means there were ≥ 2 students or staff who could have been close contacts only in the school with confirmed COVID-19 within a 14-day period. An outbreak is closed after 28 days have passed without a new case that could have been transmitted in the school.

Of 23 COVID-19 outbreaks in schools, 21 (91%) are open and 2 (9%) are closed.





Of 93 school outbreak-associated COVID-19 cases, 62 (67%) are in students and 31 (33%) are in staff.

Coming Soon! Updated Isolation and Quarantine Guidance



- English is completed; awaiting Spanish translation
 - Go-live goal on website: early next week
- **No changes to substance**, just more detailed/logical flow charts
- Includes school-specific scenarios regarding chronic conditions and alternate lab-confirmed diagnoses; clearly states close contact time of >10 minutes is cumulative, etc.
- Please be sure to delete outdated guidance documents once new guidance is in place

Reminder: Testing for Exposed Students/Staff



- Banner Urgent Care sites now available for testing:
 - Students/staff exposed to a case(s)
 - Symptomatic students/staff (including students/staff included in a CLI outbreak)
- If there are no Banner Urgent Care facilities close to a school, contact CommunityTesting@maricopa.gov for testing support.

COVID-19 SCHOOL TESTING

You have been identified as either having close contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 or as someone who is experiencing COVID-like symptoms (fever (>100.4°F), cough, shortness of breath, difficulty breathing, chills, sore throat, headache, muscle/body aches, runny nose or congestion, vomiting, diarrhea, and/or a new loss of taste or smell).

Maricopa County and Banner Health Urgent Care have teamed up to offer you COVID-19 testing **at no cost to you.**

TESTING APPOINTMENTS MUST BE MADE AHEAD OF TIME

Insurance information will be requested; however, you will not be asked for any out-of-pocket payments including co-pays.

WHEN SHOULD I GET TESTED?	WHY SHOULD I GET TESTED?	CAN I GO BACK TO SCHOOL WITH A NEGATIVE TEST?
Testing is recommended any time after day 7 through day 14 of quarantine period. You can develop symptoms up to 14 days after close contact with an infectious person. You can get tested anytime during those 14 days but most people develop symptoms within a week.	If you or someone in your family is at higher risk for severe complications due to COVID-19, you may want to know if you are carrying the virus. While waiting for the 14-day quarantine period to expire, it is a good idea to stay away from anyone in the family who may be at higher risk and to wear a mask while in public.	No. Because you can develop symptoms for up to 14 days after close contact with an infectious person, you must remain out of school for 14 days , even if your test is negative.

Reminder: Testing for Exposed Students/Staff



- Flier (English and Spanish) will be attached/included in follow-up email from Public Health during the reporting/investigation process
- Exposed students/staff or symptomatic students/staff identified by the school should get the flier and can use it at a Banner Urgent Care location for testing
- Insurance information may be asked, but **no out-of-pocket costs.**
- **NOT to be used for screening (finite resource)**

COVID-19 Diagnostic Testing



- PCR test
 - Detects genetic material (RNA) of the virus using a lab technique called polymerase chain reaction (PCR).
 - Considered highly accurate
 - Results may be available in as little as 24 hours or a few days depending on the lab's proximity to the testing site and other factors.
- A health care worker collects fluid from the nose or throat.
 - More recently, some sites use shorter, less invasive swabs to swab inside the nostrils
 - Less uncomfortable than the nasopharyngeal swab.
 - Saliva-based PCR testing, where you spit into a small collection tube, is now also available

COVID-19 Diagnostic Testing



- ANTIGEN test
 - Detects certain proteins in the virus
 - Antigen tests can produce results in minutes.
 - A positive antigen test result is considered very accurate, but there's an increased chance of false-negative results —
 - It's possible to be infected with the virus but still have a negative result.
 - Depending on the situation, your health care provider may recommend a PCR test to confirm a negative antigen test result.
 - Uses a nose or throat swab to get a fluid sample
- **Antigen** tests are not the same as **antibody** tests.
 - Antibody, or serology, tests are used to detect a past infection with COVID-19
 - Blood test to detect the presence of antibodies.
 - Antibody tests are not designed to detect an active infection of the virus and should not be used for diagnostic purposes.



COVID Symptoms Questions



- Stomach aches vs nausea/vomiting/diarrhea
- Headache – occurs in 8-12% of COVID cases
 - Can be only presenting symptom
 - Usually in conjunction with other symptoms
- Conjunctivitis
 - JAMA Ophthalmology 8.26.20 – 22.7% of 216 children hospitalized in Wuhan, China had ocular manifestations including conjunctivitis

COVID Questions



- What day do we start the count (quarantine or isolation)?
 - Close contact exposure, start of symptoms or asymptomatic positive test = Day 0
- Does a close contact who was COVID + in past 3 months need to quarantine?
 - No! (Also included in updated Isolation & Quarantine guidance.)
- If I fax a report and do not hear back, what should I do?


