9:30 – 11:00 AM	<p><b>Health Equity Presentation &amp; Discussion</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Last QPM – had a discussion around charting HIPMC’s path forward post-pandemic</li> <li>• <b>Which facts were known to you/which were not?</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Flooding in the Rio Salado was the first example of segregation in South Phoenix</li> <li>- Differences of lived experiences among Chicanos who lived north/south of the Rio Salado</li> <li>- Found “perceived” to be an interesting term used in one of the laws</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Is there something missing?</b></li> <li>• <b>Are there similar narratives in other communities?</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Community division, growing opportunities of communication</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Post 41 – catalyst for social change in South Phoenix</li> <li>• CPLC – putting \$1M to rehab Santa Rita Center</li> <li>• <b>“Farmworker Movement” (CA/TX)</b> – major catalyst for social action in PHX           <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Boswell Farm Boycott</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>PHX Union High School 50-Day Walkout</b> – ending segregation in this school district (50% of students participated)</li> </ul>	Gilbert Arvizu



	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Recall of Gov Jack Williams</b> – signed house bill 2134 which didn't allow farmworkers to organize</li> <li>• <b>In excluded communities' pre-civil rights era, Fr. Albert Braun and community leaders addressed community issues with a wholistic lens. Is this still the case today?</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Post pandemic – addressing SDOH, cannot care for individuals without looking at a wholistic approach</li> <li>- Post pandemic – focused on reconstructing how we can embark engagement with communities while acknowledging history and discussing how we can best move forward</li> <li>- Taking a holistic approach for LGBTQ+ health movement @ SW Center incorporating many intersectionalities and imbedding trauma-informed care</li> <li>- Shared that I-17 was federally funded – When we think about the partners that do the work in the community most of it is also federally funded. If funding is put into the community, work is going to be completed in the way that leadership wants it to be completed which becomes a significant limitation to addressing community issues through a wholistic approach</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Where are we now?</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Preparing for silver tsunami</li> <li>- Pre-pandemic in AZ – older adult population experiencing homelessness had increased by 20%</li> </ul> </li> <li>• <b>Redlining</b> – where segregation happened of those living in PHX had to do with the Rio Salado flooding</li> <li>• <b>What is one takeaway and one thing that we can use to make Maricopa County a more equitable community?</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- We have to look at the privilege of the groups we're all apart of to become a part of the change starting with our organizations/partnerships/advocacy that needs to happen.</li> <li>- Now, we need to focus on cultural responsiveness</li> <li>- We often look at the issues of systemic racism and genderism at the individual level instead of a structural and institutional level</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
