The Mission of the Integrated Criminal Justice Information System is to provide automated systems, information technology expertise, and information pathways to justice and law enforcement agencies, and to develop and implement systems that promote the sharing of criminal justice information that is timely, secure, reliable, and comprehensive, so that criminal justice agencies may more efficiently enhance public safety, improve service to the community, and make quality justice and law enforcement decisions.

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ICJIS Focus Area – New Video Visitation System Pilot

On Friday June 7, 2002, the Sheriff's Office New Jail Construction Office, Technology Bureau, and ICJIS successfully implemented an advanced technology Video Visitation System (VVS) in the Estrella Support Bldg. (ESB), which serves both male and female inmates assigned to the Tents facility. The pilot allows the MCS the ability to centrally schedule family and legal consultation visits with inmates – with visitations conducted remotely from various County locations.

Factors toward successful implementation –

- System design provided necessary reliability and performance metrics in integrating the current Jail Management System Visitation Module to the vendor system.
- The ICJIS Integration Engine (IE) was identified as the integration tool.
- The ICJIS IE team was given the challenge of processing a new JMS visitation request via the required 3-tier architecture (JMS → IE → VVS → JMS) reliably in 10 seconds or less.
- During system acceptance testing, the ICJIS solution consistently beat the 10-second goal, achieving an average of 6 seconds or less for the full Schedule-Visit cycle.

The ESB installation is a Proof of Concept Pilot with -

- 25 visitor booths and 36 inmate booths
- planned implementation for the new 4th Ave Jail (300 visitor booths & 172 inmate booths)
- planned rollout for the new Lower Buckeye Road Jail (63 visitor booths & 100 inmate booths)
